Assessment

Discussion

The discussion focused on the possibility of decentralizing the assessment process and allowing individual departments to take responsibility for completing their own assessment. The committee would serve as resource and would review assessment procedures and results. Assessment must be faculty driven and not delivered or mandated top-down. All new courses must have a plan for assessment but need not be excessive. ON a rotating schedule currently approved courses should provide outcome data. Certain courses, dictated by size and popularity, may require special attention. Later in the process a discussion must ensue regarding how to make the assessment plans and goals more public. A question of reappraisal versus re-approval was discussed. A work load issue for the committee exists between these two definitions.
