Course Requests

Revision to the Chinese major program - approved

Modern Greek H241- course change request - They need to be more explicit about study abroad component, in both the proposal and the syllabus. It is not very clear who is eligible to go to the trip in spring break (it should be worded as “spring break” instead of spring quarter)—e.g., only students enrolled in H241? Or anyone who’s taken either version of 241? Etc. Will this be as a International Ed. 697? How many credits? Etc. Also, Final exam date and time should be explicitly shown in the calendar.

Korean 680 - approved. Needs some clarification. Course info will not appear in Book 3. The syllabus needs to be clearer about the suggested and required readings, what is on reserve or in a packet. Final exam should be indicated in the calendar.

Korean 653- approved. Some members thought that there is a disconnection between the readings and the stated goal. They can clarify the link between goals and the readings. Prerequisite course number (509) should be on the cover sheet.

Linguistics 280- new course request. They need to put the final exam in the course calendar (e.g., final exam will take place as listed in the master schedule). Instructor name and contact information is missing in the syllabus. They need to indicate if they want the course info appear in Book 3.

Linguistics 303- new course request. As an upper division course, it needs a prerequisite (110 or second year status.) Final exam needs to be indicated in the schedule.

Linguistics 505 - new course request. More detailed contact information should be included.

Linguistics 305- withdrawal request- approved

Linguistics 595- new course request- the credit hours can be increased to 5. Beth Hume will take the suggestions to her department and she will report the changes in the next meeting.
