- Add GEC language to the syllabus, including the category it is in and the criteria that it addresses.
- Clarify the distinction between the final exams and the 1-hour exams.

- Following the Arts and Sciences trends of the past few years, the committee strongly suggests that you list, at a minimum, English 110 as a prerequisite. (This is a 500-level course and should have some prerequisites).
- Academic misconduct and disability services statements should be included on the syllabus (template can be found on our website).
- A chart of the breakdown of the percentages should be added -- for example, 20% attendance and participation, 20% quizzes, etc.
