PROPOSED REVISION TO THE ARTS ENTREPRENUERSHIP MINOR

The Department of Arts Administration, Education & Policy requests the following changes to the current Arts Entrepreneurship Minor due to new faculty expertise in arts entrepreneurship and our student's interest in a more focused approach to the minor.

Business course selections remain the same. Students will continue to take:

BUSMHR 2500 Entrepreneurship
BUSMHR 3510 New Venture Creation

Students will now take ARTEDU 3690, focused specifically on entrepreneurship within the arts, and then will select *either* ARTEDU 3680 or ARTEDU 3681 depending on their preferences for non-profit or for-profit sectors.

3). ARTEDU 5683 Developing Arts Careers

We feel this will prepare arts entrepreneurship minors by allowing them to better understand arts entrepreneurship with regard to specific arts disciplines, to see the arts more broadly within entrepreneurship, and to focus on either for-profit or non-profit sectors.
