

The **purpose of OCSS**, as described in Ohio Revised Code 5145.06, is to "provide educational programs for prisoners to allow them to complete adult education courses, earn Ohio certificates of high school equivalence, or pursue vocational training."

PLEASE NOTE:

FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) affords the same rights to incarcerated students as it does free world students.

OSU will be first liberal arts higher ed project in Ohio's prison system.








• OPEEP courses bring campus and incarcerated students together in prison-based classrooms.

 Incarcerated students in prisons other than ORW are admitted each semester as non-degree seeking students

 Fees are canceled by OSU for incarcerated students.

• All students earn grades for their coursework.

 We have offered courses through Mansfield, Newark, Lima and Columbus campuses recently.
