RE: Video Arts Minor Revision (course additions to minor)

The Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts would like to request several curricular updates to the Video Arts minor, including: addition of five existing department course offerings in theatre and film; inclusion of department internship course numbers; and removal of Introduction to Theatre, to be replaced with television and media-theory focused introductory GE Foundations course, *Criticizing Television*.

A complete description and rationale for each change is attached, as well as a copy of the current and revised minor program forms.

These revisions respond to current and anticipated student enrollment patterns, and better aligns the course offerings to the goals of a film and video minor. The requested additions of several department courses would help to alleviate enrollment challenges, while also creating a more robust course list for students interested in production who are not part of the Moving-Image Production major. These requested changes also add relevant production courses that had not yet been developed at the time of the minor's creation, or which were added to the department through the restructuring of the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts, which merged film studies, moving-image production, and theatre to one academic unit.

Requested curricular revisions: Video Arts Minor (VIDART-MN)

Summary of changes: Addition of five existing department course offerings; inclusion of existing department internship course numbers; removal of one department course.

Background: The Video Arts minor allows students to explore traditional, alternative and artistic means of media delivery in a variety of expressive and creative contexts. This minor is administered by the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts, and offers some of the same courses as the department's film production major, MVNGIMG-BA ("MIP"). The Video Arts minor is often used as a pathway to production for students who are unable to pursue the four-year lockstep Moving-Image Production major. Currently, 32% of enrolled minors in the VIDARTS-Minor are Film Studies majors in the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts, who have a production focus area; 12% of minors are double minors with Screenwriting, also administered in the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts.

Advising note: the Video Arts Minor advising assignment has been changed as of February 2024. Academic Advisor Emily Carpenter, who also advises Film Studies and Moving-Image Production majors and associated minors, will now advise the Video Arts minor (approved by Assistant Dean of Advising and Academic Services, Mary Ellen Jenkins, 02/09/24). Advising guide is updated to reflect this change.

The Moving-Image Production area of the Department of Theatre, Film, and Media Arts would like to request several updates to the Video Arts minor, including: addition of five existing department course offerings in theatre and film; inclusion of department internship course numbers; and removal of one course (standard and honors version of Introduction to Theatre, to be replaced with television-focused GE Foundations course).

These recommendations are based on:

- Review of existing minor and department film and media curriculum and stated goals of the minor.
- Enrollment patterns and student needs, particularly as Video Arts is a minor frequently recommended as the alternative to the competitive entry/lockstep major of Moving-Image Production.
- Student petition requests received by advising, and current blocks to enrollment and time-to-degree issues.
- Need for the creation of a more formal pathway for production experience when students are not able to or not accepted to the lockstep, competitive entry MVNGIMG-BA program. This includes transfer students, campus or major change students, and Moving-Image Production Pre-majors who do not continue to the MVNGIMG-BA, to apply first-year pre-major course credits to an alternative major plan (FILMSTD-BA with VIDARTS-Minor).
- Updates to curriculum since the minor's inception/last revision, with production courses in the department that
 had not been developed at the minor's inception, but which are logical inclusions. This would also bolster
 department course enrollments while reducing time-to-degree issues by providing more available course offerings.
- Better alignment of courses to the goals of the minor with a film/video focus (for example, replacing an "Introduction to Theatre" course with the department's "Criticizing Television" course (*GE Foundations*), for coursework more aligned to the theory and concepts of film and video arts.

Required for graduation No

<u>Credit hours required</u> A minimum of 15. 1000 level courses shall not be counted in the minor. The minor must contain at least 6 units at the 3000-level or above

Transfer and EM credit hours allowed

A student is permitted to count up to 6 total hours of transfer credit and/or credit by examination.

Overlap with the GE A student is permitted to overlap up to 6 credit hours between the GE and the minor.

Overlap with the major and additional minor(s)

- The minor must be in a different subject than the major.
- The minor must contain a minimum of 12 hours distinct from the major and/or additional minor(s).

Grades required

- Minimum C- for a course to be counted on the minor.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for all minor course work.
- Course work graded Pass/Non-Pass cannot count on the minor.
