DIFFERENCES BETWEEN DOUBLE MAJOR AND TWO DEGREES (under Legacy GE)

Double major: completing two or more majors but just one baccalaureate degree

- Two majors
 - Some overlap between majors and/or between major and GE is permitted
 - There must be at least 18 independent/"unique" hours in each major
 - Both majors must be complete at the time of graduation
 - A major from another college can only be completed as a double major if that college allows the major to be added as a second major ("tagged" degree majors are not eligible for this)
- 121 hours are required
- 39 upper division hours are required
- Student receives one diploma

Two degrees: completing two baccalaureate degrees

- Each degree must "stand alone," meaning two distinct majors:
 - No overlap between majors is permitted
 - No overlap between either major and the GE is permitted
- 151 hours are required
- 57 upper division hours are required
- Student receives two diplomas—one for each degree
 - The two degrees can be earned at one time, or one after the other
 - o If one degree is a BS and one is a BA, the difference in GE requirements must be completed (e.g., calculus for the BS even though calculus is not required for the BA)
 - If one of the degrees is from a college other than ASC, all degree requirements for each college must be completed
