Subject: Department of Art BA/BFA Revisions

Subcommittee B considered the proposal from the Department of Art to modify their requirements for the B.A. and B.F.A. degrees at its meeting on April 4, 2008. After a thorough examination and a comprehensive discussion of the proposal the subcommittee voted unanimously to approve the revisions.

Currently all students enter the program as *Pre-Art*. After a student complete 20 hours of *Foundations* coursework, the student is reviewed by the faculty. A successful review permits the student to enter the B.A. program. Then the student is asked to complete a set of 30 hours of Core requirements, which allows an introduction to many of the emphasis areas in the department. After completion of the *Core requirements*, the student applies by means of a juried portfolio to an emphasis area. If the portfolio is judged positively, then the student is accepted into an emphasis area and begins work on the specific requirements to a B.F.A. Students who are not accepted into the B.F.A. may complete a B.A. degree.

Proposed revisions:

- 1. All students will be admitted to the B.F.A
- 2. After their *portfolio review* students will be informed of their ability to continue in the B.F.A. program.
- 3. Students *may petition* the department in writing for permission to switch to a B.A. at any time after their first two quarters in the B.F.A. program.
- 4. Upon complete of the *Foundation* and *Core* requirements, a B.F.A. student must apply for acceptance into an area of emphasis.

The major change of these revision is to make the B.A. degree a student choice rather than the default degree.

The principal foci for discussion were:

- 1. The change in the relationship between the B.A. and B.F.A. degrees.
- 2. The timing of the procedural steps that students follow as they work through their degree program.
- 3. How would students who transfer from other institutions be affected?
- 4. Does a student still have only two chances to pass their portfolio review?

The College of the Arts Curriculum Committee has reviewed and voted unanimously to support the Department of Art's proposal to revise the entrance requirements for the undergraduate Bachelor of Fine Arts (a tagged degree approved by OAA in May of 1990) and Bachelor of Arts major program. We discussed the proposal with Professor Rebecca Harvey, Chair of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of Art, during our ARTS CC deliberations on Monday, January 8, 2008 and on Monday, March 3, 2008, and we were pleased to unanimously support the Department of Art's changes to the B.A./B.F.A entrance requirements.

The proposal was vetted and supported by the full faculty in the department, designed in close consultation with the Arts Advising Staff, and the Department of Art Education, and went through two revisions with the Arts CC. The Department of Art Undergraduate Studies Chair and the Department of Art Education Undergraduate Studies Chair met several times to streamline the two proposals so that their students may flow seamlessly from the BFA in Art into the senior year of the BAE in Art Education. The revisions are reflective of the field, the interdisciplinary strengths of the department, and the observations of the accrediting body of the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD). The Department has created new "checksheets" of each of its BFA emphasis areas (Glass, Printmaking, Sculpture, Art and Technology, Photography, Ceramics, Drawing and Painting) and for its BA degree so that Advisors in Arts Advising, students, and faculty will have a clear template to follow.

The BFA tagged degree is currently 196 credit hours, with 76 in the General Education Curriculum and 120 in the major program. These will remain unchanged. The primary changes are described below:

- GEC reflects the revised GEC with the current/new categories.
- The entrance requirements are changed from a tiered process of first coming in as pre-Art, then portfolio-reviewing into the BA, then another portfolio review into BFA, to entering as a BFA art student who, after 5 Foundations courses, will have his or her work reviewed by the Foundations Director and the Academic Standards Committee. This focused approach is reflective of the values of the department, puts students on track for the tagged degree in either Art or Art Ed, and adheres to NASAD standards. With this method, the creative process is able

to factor into a student's potential, rather than just the end product. It will also help the faculty identify students much earlier in the process who may be in trouble.

- New Advising Process will reach a greater number of students and ensure that they are receiving the appropriate information. The department and Arts Advising will work in tandem to advise students.
- This change to enter as BFA in Art will consequently strengthen the BA as the process to become a BA helps the students define the clear objectives and ensures focused studies to create a strong BA degree plan and not just a generalist degree. Entering as a BFA also will align students at a much earlier stage to be successful in the BAE.
- The changes will take place in Autumn 2008 for entering freshman and transfer students. The department is requesting two codes 066 for BA in Art and 065 for BFA in Art. Art Education will retain 067 for its majors and 849 for Pre-Art Ed.
- In Autumn 2008 any current student will have the opportunity to declare BA or BFA in Art.

Attached please find proposed changes to the BA / BFA entrance procedures in the Department of Art.

The Department of Art seeks approval to make changes in our BA / BFA entrance procedures. None of the overall requirements for either degree have changed nor have the requirements of our accrediting body NASAD. The revisions are partially in response to the recent reduction of the BA degree to 181 credit hours and our ongoing assessment of the undergraduate program. We propose to institute these changes beginning in the Autumn Quarter 2008.

These changes are driven by several factors. With the reduction of the BA to 181 credit hours it seemed an appropriate time to revisit the requirements of both the BA and BFA degrees and to check our alignment with the BAE in Art Education. We have had a series of meetings and discussions over the past year and a half with the faculty as a whole. We formed an ad hoc committee in the fall to begin working towards an implementation plan. This committee included myself, as Undergraduate Chair, Ardine Nelson, who has served as both Undergraduate Chair and Department Chair, Alison Crocetta, the current Foundations Director and Amy Youngs, previous Foundation Director. I met several times with Kevin Tavin, the Director of Art Education to discuss how our departments' respective degrees overlap and support one antoher.

The proposal in an early form was vetted at the College Curriculum level and comments and suggestions were woven back in. There has also been input and discussion with the ASAS Arts Advising office. Sergio Soave, Department Chair, Fine Art and Valarie Mockabee, Associate Dean, College of the Arts, both weighed in thoughtfully with concrete suggestions. The current proposal reflects a very thorough process and represents a change that we as a department feel will strengthen both our BA and BFA degrees.

PROPOSAL TO CHANGE THE DEPARTMENT OF ART BA / BFA DEGREE ENTRANCE PROCESS

The Department of Art seeks approval to make changes in our BA / BFA entrance/exit procedures. None of the overall requirements for either degree have changed nor have the requirements of our accrediting body NASAD. The revisions are partially in response to the recent reduction of the BA degree to 181 credit hours and our ongoing assessment of the undergraduate program. We propose to institute these changes beginning in the Autumn Quarter 2008.

We currently have a two-tier review process in place. All students, whether their intentions are BA, BFA, or BAE enter our program as Pre-Art. Upon completion of 20 hours of Foundations coursework the students are reviewed by the Faculty successful completion places them in the BA degree program. The student is then asked to complete a set of 30 hours of Core requirements, allowing an introduction to many of the emphasis areas offered in the Art Department. At this point the student is ready to apply by a juried portfolio to an emphasis area and begin work on their BFA. They should also be able to decide at this time, somewhere around the end of the second year to continue in the BA program or move into the BAE. While sound in theory, we have found this system to be generally unworkable in practice, as it does not adequately take into consideration the large curricular differences that have been taking place between BA, BFA, and BAE. We are proposing to streamline our system, taking into consideration and building upon the many strengths offered by these different degrees.

The BFA is a tagged degree approved by OAA May 30, 1990 and consists of 196 credit hours. This degree denotes specialized studio training. The seven major areas of study are: Art & Technology, Ceramics, Glass, Painting/Drawing, Photography, Printmaking and Sculpture. A strong program in all of these disciplines offers state of the art facilities, experienced faculty, and provides a major opportunity for personal and artistic growth.

The Department of Art sees itself first and foremost as a professional degree-granting program. Our focus at the undergraduate level continues to be the BFA although we also offer an increasingly popular BA degree and minor and serve as practical training laboratory for Art Education. The BA in Art is a liberal arts degree program. The BA in Art serves as a general introduction to the experiences of the artist. It involves studio practice in all areas of the department and in art history and theory. This degree may be used as a springboard into a variety of careers.

Art Education's BAE undergraduate offerings include discipline focused courses, general education courses, and licensure courses. It provides undergraduate students with a well-rounded liberal arts education, intensive studies in visual culture, and significant preparatory course work in the theory and practice of art education.

While there are considerable areas of overlap in these three curriculums there are also distinct differences and we have had increasing trouble over the past few years in moving students into the correct track for their career goals.

Because of our mission to continue to be one of the most comprehensive studio-based university art programs in America all students entering the program will be tagged BFA.

- 1. The Director of Foundation Studies will be charged with creating a new system for having Foundation Studies instructors measurably evaluate their BFA students.
- 2. An Academic Standards Committee will be formed. The Undergraduate Chair and Director of Foundation Studies will be on the committee with three additional rotating faculty members. The committee will be charged with discussing and reviewing the progress of the BFA students.
- Students will be informed of their ability to continue in the BFA program after the Foundation coursework is completed based upon review by the Academic Standards Committee. (NASAD required entrance requirements would be met through the successful completion and review of the five Foundation Studies courses).
- 4. There are sound reasons for choosing a BA in Art. All students wishing to complete the BA degree may petition the department, in writing, at any time after their first two quarters in the BFA program for permission to enter the BA program. Allowing an early shift to the BA degree ensures those students wishing to pursue their foreign language component to do so without any loss of competency.
- 5. Upon completion of the Foundation and the Core the BFA student <u>must</u> apply to and be accepted by an area of emphasis. This will be done by preparing a portfolio of Foundation and Core coursework. Students will meet with the Faculty of the emphasis area to present their work and participate in an interview process.
- 6. The BAE, as a degree, is perhaps best seen in this light as an area of emphasis. We continue to be committed to giving this population of students the best possible grounding in the Studio Arts while taking into consideration their curricular needs. The BFA is the best track to follow for students wishing to pursue the BAE. The first 2 years of the BFA align with the Department of Art Education's BAE and prepares students for entrance into this tagged degree.

At the end of year two the BFA student will have completed an additional 45 credits as follows: 15-20 credits of GEC, completed the Core of 30 credits, completed an additional 5-10 credits of work beyond core. They are prepared to apply to the BFA Emphasis area they desire at this time. This layout of the first two years <u>assures</u> that the BFA student completes the foundation and core work of 50 credits and between 10 and 20 hours of the next level of art courses and at least 35 hours of GEC.

Total 96 hours completed during the first two years.

During the next two years the BFA student will continue the balance of one GEC course per quarter to two art studios. Students will have two years to complete their Emphasis area which allows them to enroll in the appropriate courses that might be offered only once per year or once every two years.

Advising Plan

The Department of Art works very closely with USAS Arts Advising and will continue to do so. The support that their office provides is invaluable both for faculty and students. The proposed changes in our advising structure will supplement and support USAS Arts Advising' efforts. These changes are as follows:

The Undergraduate Chair will organize and announce to all the first and second year BFA students that there will be one mass-advising meeting for each group held in the evening during the first week of scheduling for the following quarter. These groups will include those students already in the university who recently declared themselves a BFA in Art. The Director of the Foundations Program will be present for the meeting with first year students. Students will receive, via email, a list of the appropriate courses for them to enroll in the following quarter. This list would also be posted online for them to access at any time. If they have any questions or wish to hear about general information or wish to speak with an advisor from a possible area of emphasis they should attend the meeting.

Create a first and second year email list. Depending on their year, the courses as described quarter by quarter in the 4-year plan would be sent to them as a reminder of which courses they need to enroll in. Each emphasis area will be responsible for devising what it recommends for enrollment each quarter accounting for their pattern of course offerings. All first and second year BFA students will be well served through this advisement, email, and group meeting. The further along in the program the less general advising they will require.

Each first and second year student will be assigned a faculty advisor, who they could contact for additional advising as necessary.

Once the BFA student entered an emphasis area, a faculty person from that area will be assigned as their advisor. This faculty person would guide them through the process of selecting courses and planning their remaining two years of study, just as the current process provides for, including quarterly advising day.

Implementation

Beginning with Autumn Quarter 2008 all incoming freshmen that wish to major in art will be listed as a BFA art major. Any student currently in the program will have this one opportunity to simply declare himself or herself a BA in Art or a BFA in Art. After Autumn quarter 2008 any student wishing to be a BA in Art must petition the Undergraduate Chair with their request. We request there be two major codes instead of the one 066. 066 would remain BA and 065 designate BFA in Art. Art Education would retain 067 for majors and 849 for those students who wish to declare themselves Pre - Art Ed.

Any current BA or pre-art major that declares themselves to be a BFA in Art must meet with their Art Faculty advisors to review their progress toward the BFA (review their department check sheet). This will also be an advising session about working toward their emphasis area portfolio review and by what date they should submit their application. Records will be kept that indicate when this group of declared BFA's should complete their Emphasis application.

The normal BA portfolio review scheduled for June 08 will be suspended. There will be several open meetings in the late spring 2008 with current pre-art and BA students to explain the changes and options they have. This information will also be emailed to all the pre-art and BA Art majors. The entire regular faculty will also be prepared to discuss this switchover with intended majors in their classes.

BFA EMPHASIS AREA APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Revised Spring 2008

The BFA is a professional degree. To this end all students in the BFA program are required to choose a specific area of emphasis in order to focus their program of study. The BFA program at Ohio State is open enrollment, however in order to fulfill the status conferred by a professional degree all students continuing in the BFA beyond 6 quarters are required to pass an Emphasis Area Review in their chosen area of concentration. The 7 areas of concentration offered are: Art & Technology, Ceramics, Glass, Painting & Drawing, Photography, Printmaking, and Sculpture. The BAE (Bachelor of Art Education) is also a professional degree and students interested in pursuing this degree should follow the BFA procedures. Entrance into the BAE program occurs in the same time frame as the BFA emphasis area application (further information on BAE entrance procedures is available from the Department of Art Education).

To apply to any emphasis area in the BFA you must first, submit your written application form, your formal application / artist statement, a current copy of your advising report, and a completed area check sheet to the Art office, 146 Hopkins Hall. You will be scheduled to meet with at least two regular faculty to review your application portfolio and discuss your goals as an artist. These reviews will take place in the studio facilities of the emphasis area you are applying to and will provide a limited amount of time for all applicants to appropriately hang, layout, install, load on computer or otherwise prepare your work for the review.

You will be notified of the outcome of the review by written letter and email from Chair of the undergraduate programs during the following week. For those accepted into an emphasis area the letter will include information about contacting your new art faculty advisor. For those not accepted into the emphasis area additional information will be provided about your options.

YOU MUST APPLY FOR AN EMPHASIS AREA WITHIN 6 QUARTERS OF ENROLLMENT IN THE BFA.

WHEN AND WHERE:

The application process begins the quarter before the intended review.

- 1. The written portion of the application is due in 146 Hopkins before noon Friday of Finals week. For those applying in early Autumn the written application is due by the first Friday of Autumn quarter.
- 2. The fifth Friday of the following quarter each applicant presents his or her portfolio to the faculty.
- 3. The sixth week of the quarter the Undergraduate Chair will notify the candidate in writing of the outcome of their review.

REQUIREMENTS:

APPLICATION, WRITTEN STATEMENT, PORTFOLIO OF ARTWORK, INTERVIEW

B.F.A. Emphasis Area Applicants must first complete the Foundation series of courses, the bulk of the Core series, and up to 2 courses in their intended emphasis area. Your Faculty advisor will help you decide on an appropriate time to apply. Your application consists of 4parts:

The application packet
Your written statement (included in your application packet)
Your portfolio
Your interview

YOUR APPLICATION PACKET consists of 4 pages, your application form (see attached), your written statement (see below), a copy of your advising report, and your Arts Advising check sheet. These forms are available in the Art Office and on the department website.

YOUR WRITTEN STATEMENT consists of a 3 paragraph (not more than 500 words) Your artist / application statement should include:

- 1. Some background history, who you are, how you became interested in Art, and why you decided to study at Ohio State.
- 2. Reasons why you are applying to your particular area of emphasis
- 3. The strengths and challenges you have identified in your Artwork to date.

The quality of writing and thinking presented in your written statement will be a consideration in the application outcome.

Applicants must have a 2.25 minimum GPA in the Art major courses and a 2.0 minimum overall GPA

YOUR PORTFOLIO must include examples of work consistent with the advice of your emphasis area. Generally it is expected that you will present 12 – 15 pieces. Select your very best work; include at minimum 4 to 8 pieces that are reflective of your interest and ability in your proposed area(s) of concentration. Depending on the area, you may want to include either actual pieces or documentation of your artwork. Acceptable documentation includes photographic prints, color printouts, or slides in a slide page (will not be projected). Documentation intended for viewing on a computer must be on CD that will run on a Mac and in an appropriate presentation form such as Keynote, PowerPoint or QuickTime.

Each emphasis area has specific courses they will recommend you complete before applying and may also have additional advice about the amount and range of work from the core courses to present. This information will be available at the quarterly advising meetings.

You will have approximately one hour to prepare your portfolio presentation in the designated space provided by the emphasis area. Be sure to plan for all your needs and bring any tools, computer or A-V, electric cords, hangers, tape, pins etc. with you. Any exception will have to be negotiated with the area coordinator prior to review day. Some areas may have specific computers for you to use and in that case bring your files on CD in presentation form (Keynote, PowerPoint, QuickTime, etc.) ready to run on a Mac.

YOUR INTERVIEW will take place with the faculty of the area in the portfolio viewing space. Those students not currently presenting work will be asked to wait outside. You will have approximately 10 minutes for the review. The faculty will have reviewed your written materials prior to the portfolio interview. Be prepared to present your work and to answer questions about your written materials.

Removing your work will begin as soon as all interviews have concluded in that area and must be completely removed and the area restored to its original configuration on that day.

Official notification of the outcome will come from the Chair of the Undergraduate programs by letter and email early the next week.

HOW YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE EVALUATED:

Each team of faculty will evaluate the works in your presented portfolio, combined with the written statement and interview. This synthesized evaluation will ensure that each element of the portfolio and interview process reflects a solid knowledge base and the potential for success in the rigorous professional preparation that is expected of each student in a BFA course of study at The Ohio State University.

A successful application to your chosen area of emphasis will be reflected in evidence of your aesthetic and conceptual potential, a focus and commitment beyond the minimum course requirements as presented in your portfolio, the clarity and depth of your written statement, and your capacity to participate fully in the interview process.

Please note: Although taken into consideration this review will not solely be based on individual course grades or your cumulative GPA at OSU.

TRANSFER STUDENTS:

Students who transferred to Ohio State with studio art credits from another university, college or other educational institution will need to schedule an interview through the Art Department Office (146 Hopkins Hall) with the Undergraduate Chair. At this meeting a students standing in the BFA program will be determined and a Faculty advisor will be assigned.

NON-ACCEPTANCE:

If you are not accepted into your emphasis area you will meet with the Undergraduate Chair to decide upon a course of action. At this point you may petition to reapply to the same or different emphasis area, petition to pursue the BA degree in Art or petition to withdraw from the BFA program entirely. Students deciding to reapply will have up to two quarters from the date of their first emphasis review to reapply. Students who are not admitted after their second application will not be permitted to pursue a BFA at Ohio State. At this point their options will be to petition to apply to the BA degree or withdraw from the program.
