1. PROGRAM:

Graduate Program in Greek and Latin; leads to

- M.A. in Modern Greek
- Ph.D. in Modern Greek

The Dept decided to turn the mandatory M.A. into an optional ("terminal") one and to admit students only to the Ph.D., starting with the new calendar; the proposal is pending with the Graduate School.

2. UNIT RESPONSIBLE:

3. PROGRAM RATIONALE:

a. Program Goals:

- 1. To foster in students an appreciation of Greek literature (in the original and translation) and culture
- 2. To enable students to gain proficiency in the Greek language
- 3. To foster in students an understanding of the Hellenic diaspora
- 4. To instill in students a global awareness and the interaction of societies
- 5. To bring to campus internationally recognized faculty to lecture on topics related to Greek culture

b. Conversion:

The program is converted without any change in the overall program goals, and only the minimal changes to curriculum requirements that are the result of the new calendar framework and the change from mandatory to optional M.A.

4. LIST OF SEMESTER COURSES

a. Courses shared between Advanced Undergraduates and Entry Level Graduate Students:

• MGR5510 Contemporary Greek Prose (03)

Reading and analysis of short stories and novels representative of major developments and trends in Greek prose of the 19^{th} and 20^{th} centuries. AU, SP Sems. Prereq: 4002

MGR 5520 Contemporary Greek Poetry (03)

Reading and analysis of short and longer poems representative of major developments and trends in Greek poetry of the 19th and 20^{th} centuries. AU, SP Sems. Prereq: 4002.

MGR 5930 Individual Studies UGRD 01-03

Individual Studies.

AU, SP Sems. Prereq: Permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 12 cr hrs. This course is graded S/U.

MGR 5940 Individual Studies UGRD 01-03

Group Studies.

AU, SP Sems. Prereq: Permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 12 cr hrs. This course is graded S/U.

MGR 5970 Study at a Foreign Institution (01-09)

An opportunity for students to study at a foreign institution and receive Ohio State credit for that work. SU, AU, SP Sems. Prereq: Written permission of dept. chairperson. Repeatable to a maximum of 27 cr hrs. This course is Progress ("P") graded. Students will pay Ohio State fees and any fees in excess of Ohio State tuition, as well as all travel and subsistence costs.

b. Courses for Entry and Intermediate Level Graduate Students:

MGR 7210 Studies in Modern Greek Literature (03)

Advanced study of specific literary periods, figures, and /or topics, involving extensive reading and discussion of appropriate primary and secondary source materials. AU, SP Qtrs. Prereq: 3 cr hrs of Modern Greek literature at the 500 level or equiv.

c. Courses for Intermediate and Advanced Level Graduate Students:

MGR 7830H Honors Research (01-03)

A program of research for each student which includes individual conferences and which culminates in an honors thesis or oral defense. SU, AU, SP Sems. Arr. Prereq: Approved candidacy for graduation with distinction, which includes faculty advisor and ASC Honors Committee approval of project, a minimum 3.50 pt-hr ratio in the field of distinction, sr standing, and CPHR commensurate with honors program membership.

MGR 7110 Seminar in Modern Greek Studies (03)

Advanced study of specific topic, involving extensive reading and discussion of appropriate primary and secondary source materials. AU, SP Sems. 4-5 cl. Prereq: 3 cr hrs of Modern Greek literature at the 500 level or equiv. Repeatable to a maximum of 9 cr hrs.

• MGR9980 Research in Modern Greece (03-06)

Research for thesis purposes only. SU, AU, SP Sems. Prereq: Permission of instructor. Repeatable to a maximum of 6 cr hrs.

5. TRANSITION POLICY

Since the program has not changed in any significant manner, we do not foresee transition problems that go beyond the adaption of the quarter credit hours to the semester requirements at the ratio of 5:3.
