Rationale for Course Change Request for Psych 804.

Dr. Randy Nelson is a relatively recent hire at Ohio State. He is a recognized scholar in Physiological Psychology and Behavioral Neuroscience. Since coming here he has organized a continuing seminar on comparative psychology that involves presentations of current research by faculty in related departments at Ohio State (e.g. EEOB), in sister universities in Ohio (e.g. Kent State, Denison), and visiting national scholars.

The topics of this advanced comparative psychology seminar change each quarter, but the attached syllabus from Spring 2005 illustrates the content and conduct of the seminar.

At present, the most appropriate course title is Psychology 804, but this is not a repeatable course. Given the nature of the seminar, as described above, it is desirable that graduate students be able to enroll in more than one offering of the seminar. Hence the request to make Psychology 804 repeatable to a maximum of 15 credit hours.
