Central Asia exists as a crossroads on the frontiers of Europe, the Middle East, India and China. This course demonstrates the historical interconnectedness of the main centers of Eurasian civilizations. It will also address such major social transformations as the gradual association of Central Asian peoples with the Islamic faith and the concomitant "Turkicization" of the region as wave upon wave of Turkic nomads migrated from the northern steppe to the southern sedentary areas. A survey history of Islamic Central Asia therefore represents an important component of world history that is lacking from the department's current slate of course offerings.
