Each of you that are enrolled must do the following 4 things:

1. Attend every seminar or email me if you can't make it.
2. Write a referee report for 4 of the 10 papers that are presented. You can pick which 4. Assume the paper was submitted to JET, I'm the associate editor, and I asked you to write me a referee report. The referee report is anonymous and for the author to read (I won't really give it to the author), and you also need to write a cover letter to me summarizing your opinion. Stop by my office if you want to see an example. Turn these in to me IN PDF FORMAT BY EMAIL by 3:30 PM Tuesday the week following the seminar.
3. Meet with 2 different speakers one-on-one for 30 minutes and tell them about your research; they will give valuable feedback. But I want each speaker to meet with at most one of you, so we need to coordinate. The list of speakers is below and on my website. Reply to this email listing the two you want, and make sure to CC everyone else. I will assign them first-come, first-served. You are also strongly encouraged to go to lunch with additional speakers whenever possible.
4. We will meet twice as a group, once after week 5, and once after the quarter is over. Come prepared to discuss a possible research idea or extension that you thought of based on one of the presentations. Try to sketch some (fairly detailed) notes on how your model might look and what you think the results might be. Maybe even solve a special case or example if possible.
