


Scope

The weekly seminar series is designed to provide exposure to ongoing research in the broad area of macroeconomics that includes closed-economy macroeconomics, open-economy macroeconomics, growth and trade, financial economics and money and banking.

Meeting

Normally, seminars will take place at ARPS Hall 437 each Monday from 3:30 to 5:00. See the attached schedule for detail. Papers could be picked up from ARPS Hall 410 (front desk) several days before the seminar.

Requirements:

1. Attend all the seminars.
2. Read the seminar paper each week. Write up a one page review of the paper each week. The review is intended to be a mini referee report. Typically, a referee report provides a succinct summary, highlights the importance and strength, points out the weaknesses and deficiencies, raises questions about the presentation and procedures, and suggests additional or alternative work to improve the paper. Include some of these elements in your review. Write the review in a Microsoft Word document, and email it to me as an attachment before the beginning of seminar.

Grading:

The final grade will be determined by your overall performance in fulfilling the course requirements. Students are strongly encouraged to actively participate in the workshop. Extra credits will be given to those who ask questions during seminar or interact with the speaker before and after seminar.
