In its various iterations, English H597.04 will allow advanced undergraduate honors students to investigate important dimensions of the production and consumption of contemporary narrative, using specific interdisciplinary research areas including cognition, emotion, and ethics. The interdisciplinary of the course will serve students in the arts and as well as the social and natural sciences.
