Course Objective: To learn the fundamentals of Latin grammar and syntax and to prepare the student for reading authentic connected prose and poetry in Latin 104. We will be covering through Unit 16 of the Moreland and Fleisher text.

Participation/Attendance: Daily attendance and active participation is mandatory given the intensive nature of this course. For each absence beyond the third, the student will lose two percentage points from their Participation/Attendance grade.

Quizzes: A five or ten minute quiz will be given three or four times per week. These quizzes will review both old and new material. There will be **no make-ups** for these quizzes except in the event of a dire emergency (i.e., death in the family). As a result, **two** of your lowest quiz grades will be dropped.

Take Home Quizzes: There will be six take-home quizzes given at the end of Units 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, and 15. These are intended to reinforce the material learned in each unit. Five will count toward the student's final grade.

Exams: There will be two major exams in this course. The Midterm will cover Units 9-11 and is scheduled for **Friday, January 28**. The final will be given on Wednesday, March 16 at 7:30 AM in UH 90.
