SUBSTANTIVE COMMENTS:

- 1) Regarding the B.S. degree, I am confused about the status of Math 1152 in the proposed program. It has apparently been removed from the list of Program Prerequisites. On the other hand, it reappears in Part B of "Proposed semester-based advising sheet", and is there listed as a 4 semester hour course, although it is in fact a 5 semester hour course. Moreover, the mistyped (12) says: Math 152 had been a prerequisite, but is being dropped as a prerequisite even though it remains part of the B.S. I believe, however, that the GE math requirement for a B.S. will in fact only be Math 1151, NOT Math 1151 and 1152. If so, Econ needs to clarify what level of Math it will expect from its B.S. students.
