
Dear Professor Krissek:

The CCI's Arts and Humanities 2 subcommittee reviewed the minor in South Asia Studies electronically and voted unanimously on May 23 to send it on to the full CCI. Only a few questions pertaining to the proposal were raised by members of the committee. The most important was that a letter from the director (or person in charge) of this interdisciplinary minor is required. A second small problem needing to be addressed at some point before the semester advising sheet is given to students is that the 6-hr upper level requirement should be stated explicitly. (This requirement is mentioned in the proposal on the page headed "List of semester courses" but is not on the semester advising sheet itself.) There were two minor issues relating to the PACER form. First, the PACER table should be changed to align with Val's statement that only the top line is filled out. Second, the "Program Plan Code Abbreviation" is given as SASIAST but probably should be SASIAST-MN.

Dear Larry,

The Oversight Committee for the South Asian Studies Minor completed and submitted its proposal in early fall 2010 for the semester version of its interdisciplinary minor: Minor in South Asian Studies. The Arts and Humanities Disciplinary Advisory Panel for Curriculum within the College of Arts and Sciences reviewed and unanimously approved the undergraduate minor during its meeting on May 11, 2011, provided feedback to the oversight committee, and is now forwarding it for review at full CCI. Please note that previously this minor was housed in ASC Interdisciplinary Programs Office, and with the restructuring in Arts and Sciences has moved to be administratively housed in the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Cultures. The Credit Hour Explanation Chart only lists the number of credit hours required for the minor because the minor program includes courses from multiple units, and there is no one "unit" from which the minor draws. There is not a Letter from the Chair as he is out of the country during this year, and it was impossible to obtain one from him.

Most specifically, I have highlighted the important change for the program below:

Minor in South Asian Studies: The Minor in South Asian Studies was approved by CAA on February 3, 2010. The minor is changing with minimal conversion since it was just approved a little over a year ago. Currently there are no students in the minor as it was just approved for student matriculation in Au 2011. There were five courses required on the quarter version for a total of 25 credit hours, and there are five courses required on the semester version for a total of 15 credit hours. Courses counted under quarters will count under semesters. The core course remains the same: ASC 265 Introduction to South Asia became Comparative Studies 2220 Introduction to South Asia. Additional course work is selected from the same course list, with one History of Art course blending two courses into one.

We are sending this undergraduate minor program forward for review and approval in the next stage of curricular review at the Arts and Sciences Committee on Curriculum and Instruction. The courses that are specific to all of the programs are listed under multiple Book 3 Listings across different colleges. RATIONALE FOR CHANGE WITH MINIMAL CONVERSION

This newly-approved minor program will undergo minimal changes in the semester conversion process. The overall credit- and distribution-requirements will be converted to accord with new distributions of credits under semesters. For example: 5-credit courses will become 3-credit courses; the current minimum of 25 credits for completion of the minor will become 15 credits. As under quarters, students will be able to overlap their minor credits with GEC/GE credits. Minor changes in individual student's programs will track departments' and college-wide changes in GE-requirements, course-levels, etc., and will continue to provide under semesters a coherent and in-depth education in South Asian studies.

TRANSITION POLICY

This minor is based on completion of courses with South Asia-related content in an array of departments within the College of Arts and Sciences, and has only one prerequisite. The vast majority of electives within the minor will be offered with substantially similar content in semester format. In the event of an individual student encountering difficulties related to semester-transition, we are willing to entertain petitions to count courses toward the minor which are not currently listed in the array of electives, and in exigent circumstances will arrange to complete the one requirement via independent study. The South Asia Studies Minor faculty are committed to individually advising students and helping them receive a South Asia Studies Minor.
