**Course Objectives and Student Learning Outcome:**

This course provides students with the opportunity to enhance their language-learning strategies primarily by self-monitoring their own learning activities. Students will develop awareness of the way they approach language learning, consider alternative approaches, and add enhancements to their strategies.

**Course Description:**

Develop self-monitoring skills as a way to enhance skill learning, especially in the context of intensive language study. After the initial meeting, in which the concept of self-monitoring is introduced students will be guided to upload study log entries onto course Carmen site, for discussion and instructor feedback. Additional group meetings will be scheduled as needed.

**Requirements:**

There are three requirements for this course.

1. Attendance

You are required to attend the first meeting as well as any additional group meetings scheduled.

Attendance in all group meetings required of everybody, regardless of the number of credits taken.

2. Self-monitoring Reports

Students are required to submit reports in which you reflect on your learning accomplishments and strategies for the seven-day period preceding the submission

date. Each report should consist of their daily log entries about their accomplishments and activities related to their language learning, and a short weekly summary for the week. The daily log may include such information as the location of their study, the length of time spent on a task, areas that required special attention. The reports are to be written in English.

Number of reports required depends on the number of credits you are registered for as follows.

3 credits: 7 reports, submitted every week.

2 credits: 4 reports, submitted at the end of weeks 1, 3, 5, and 7.

1 credits: 2 reports, submitted at the end of weeks 1 and 6.

### 3. Participation in on-line discussions

On-line discussions will be conducted on weekly topics. Each student is required to post a minimum of one comment each week in the discussion box of Carmen.

### **Grading:**

Grades will be determined as follows:

Attendance in group discussion session(s)      approximately 10%

Self-monitoring report posting                      approximately 60%

These reports not graded for their contents, but on their prompt submission. They are to be posted by Friday of by 7 p.m. Late posting will result in the loss of 5% per day of grade points for that report for up to 3 days, after which no points will be given for that report.

On-line discussion posting                              approximately 30%

Comments should be constructive. Any comments that are clearly abusive in nature or are direct personal attacks on any member of the discussion group will result in the immediate dismissal from the discussion forum with the associated loss of points for the course grade.

The following weekly topics guide the on-line discussions. These topics are loosely structured and may be changed with the agreement of the majority of the class.

June 10-14	What do I want to be able to do at the end of this course? What do I feel comfortable doing in the language I'm studying?
June 17-21	What are my strengths in language study? What do I do that works?
June 24-28	What's the first thing I do to get ready for class? What preparation strategies worked this week?
July 1-5	What environmental factors help me focus?

July 8-12	How do I ensure active performance in class? How many times should I forget and relearn?
July 15-19	How do I divide my tasks? What order works best for me?
July 22-26	What do I do to make use of new strategies learned in class? What changes have I made in my study habits?
