目标及课程概括 Course Goals and Procedures

上这门课的学生将自己选择一定数量的中文书面材料进行阅读并做出报告。到学期末，在他们的个人兴趣或学术领域内，学生将会习得一定程度的中文词汇，同时他们对面向有读写能力的成人的中文书面材料的理解能力也会有所提升。

In this course, learners will select, read and report on a number of written materials in Chinese. By the end of the term, students will have acquired vocabulary in fields of

personal or professional interest and improved their comprehension of Chinese texts written for educated adult native speakers.

这是一门个性化的课程：学生能够根据自己的兴趣爱好，研究方向和个人能力自己选定课程读物，并在指导教师的帮助下进行学习。

This course is personalized: reading materials are selected by the students based on their interests, research goals, and abilities and with input from the instructor.

学生需要预先约定，平均每周与指导教师单独会面三次。每次会面时，学生需要：Students will arrange to meet individually with the instructor an average of once, twice, or three times per week depending on the number of credits taken. They will repeat a cycle consisting of three sessions as follows:

1. 学生都需要准备一篇跟他们的研究有关的学术文章。在第一次会面之前他们需要把这篇文章通过电子邮件或其他恰当的方式发给指导教师。他们同时需要读这篇文章，并准备需要在同教师的会面中问的问题。这些问题需要包括该文章的各个方面：从语言到内容，到文化语境，以及文化内涵。学生同时需要准备该文章的口头摘要，并在会面时回答指导教师提出的与该文章的主要发现和研究方法相关的口头问题。

1. Students will prepare an academic article related to their research. Before the first meeting they will send it via email or other acceptable means to the instructor, read it and bring questions to the meeting. The questions will cover all aspects of the article from language to content to cultural context and implications. Students will also prepare an oral summary of the article and answer the instructor's oral questions regarding the article's major findings and methodology.

2. 第二次会面的重点是让学生继续准确地对这篇文章进行讨论，并运用合适的语法结构和习得的新词汇。第二次会面的目的是让学生能够与其他学者进行关于自己研究的顺利交流，对该文章提出问题并作出评论，在交流者之间产生很少或几乎没有语言上的障碍。

2. The second meeting will continue to focus on accurately discussing the article using proper grammar patterns and new vocabulary. The goal is to be able to talk with a fellow researcher about his/her work and offer questions and comments with little or no linguistic barrier between the conversants.

3. 第三次会面将会融合前两次会面所学的重要语法，词汇和总体的语言运用方法来让学生进行中文书面摘要的写作训练。每个学生需要准备一份书面摘要（在第三次会面前他们需要把电子版提交给指导教师），这份摘要将会在会面中被评判和讨论，最后每个学生需要对这份摘要作出修改并进行重新写作。

3. The third meeting will build on the previous two by integrating the week's important grammar, vocabulary and general language usage points in a written summary in

Chinese. Each student will prepare a written summary (submitted electronically before the meeting), which will be critiqued, discussed and finally rewritten with corrections.

主题大纲 Outline of Topics

由于该课程的个性化性质，该课程没有设立规定的题目。过去该课程涉及的题目有历史，经济，经营，财政，艺术和社会学等方面。

Given the personalized nature of the course, there is no set list of topics. Past topics have included but were not limited to history, economics, business, finance, art and sociology.

Students select topics in consultation with the instructor. The following is a sample of topical outline for a student taking this course for 3 credits. Students taking the course for 2 or 1 credit would cover fewer topics.

评估 Evaluation

所有的作业，包括学生在与教师会面时的表现，都会使用以下的 0-4 分的标准来给出成绩：

All assignments, including student performance during meetings with the instructor, are graded on a 0-4-point scale as follows:

- 4 准备得很充分、练习表演很出色，并在与中国人打交道时绝对不会有任何困难、不会让人产生不舒服或误解等；在交流中不会使用受自己母语影响的犹豫噪音（例如：“uh”），在写作中不会暴露出“外国的”语言运用。
Solid preparation with excellent performance that promises interaction with a native with no difficulty, discomfort, or misunderstanding;
no base language hesitation noise used in speaking, no telltale “foreignisms” in the written work.
- 3.5 准备得很好、练习表演出色，但偶尔犯的错误会影响其与中国人的顺畅交流。
Good preparation with superior performance, but some noticeable errors that would hinder smooth interaction with a native.
- 3 准备得很好、练习表演很好，但在交流中有明显的弱点或重复犯同样的错误。
Good preparation with good performance, but evident weakness or patterned error.
- 2.5 能看出做了一些准备，但其经常需要对话者的大量帮助。
Some preparation evident but requires a lot of help from the interlocutor.
- 2 准备得很少，使得对话者必须承担谈话的大部分责任（作为中国人的对话者为了减轻交流的重担会开始使用英语与其交流，反之亦然）。Minimum preparation, which puts a burden on the interlocutor (a native would avoid using Chinese with you shifting to English to lessen the workload or vice versa).
- 1.5 没怎么准备，不怎么参加练习活动。
Barely prepared/participating.
- 1 能看出完全没有准备。
Evidently unprepared (warm body point).
- 0 缺席。
Absent.

学分分配 Distribution of Credits
