Dear Claudia (if I may),

On Tuesday, the ASCC NMS Panel reviewed and *unanimously approved* Chemistry 5450 with the small contingency that a typo be corrected in the course description (which will appear in the course catalog). This is the text that appears on the course form:

"This course focuses on the application of NMR Spectroscopy to the structure determination and dynamics of primarily synthetic organic and organometallic products. The practical aspects of acquiring optimized, high-quality data are still beneficial for analysis of these spectra will be presented as lectures and demonstrations."

Are we correct in assuming that the word "and" should be added so that the second part of the sentence read, "are still beneficial for analysis of these spectra and will be presented as lectures and demonstrations"?

The faculty panel also has a small recommendation that when the course is offered the standard ASC Disability Statement be used (in 16-pt font) on the syllabus instead of the language used in the submitted syllabus. That standard language can be found on page 13, pt 15 on the ASC curriculum manual:

Could you please let me know how we should adjust the course description text?
