On Friday, March 29, the ASC Arts and Humanities Panel reviewed requests to add GE Diversity Global Studies to History 2201, 2280, 2375, 3221, 3229, 3281, and 3580.

I am happy to report that the requests for the following courses were *unanimously approved* by the Panel: History 2280, 2375, 3229, 3281, and 3580.

The next two courses were approved with contingency:

- History 2201: Explanation for GE Global Studies on the syllabus should be more coursespecific.
- History 3221: P. 4 of syllabus: there shouldn't be references to graduate students being
 graded differently on the midterm and final and being expected to write a longer research
 paper. This course is by definition an undergraduate course; should graduate students
 decide to take the course, they ought to be graded like everyone else in the class.

I will return History 2201 and 3221 via curriculum.osu.edu in a minute to enable the department to address those points.
