COURSE DESCRIPTION

This full-unit course is designed as the second semestre to Catalan language. You will need to pass "Catalan 5501" in order to register for this class.

The aim of this course is to provide students with a more complexe knowledge of Catalan language as well as making them culturally aware of the specificity and diversity of Catalan culture. The course will be structured around thematic units, each one of which will deal with a relevant everyday topic and tackle one or more grammar areas. Each unit will develop reading, listening, writing and speaking skills through a variety of exercises. An emphasis will be placed on the development of techniques in order to enable students to increase their vocabulary and their reading and understanding of more complex texts. This course will also include analysis of cultural texts and literature.

The course is taught in Catalan and is mainly assessed in Catalan, although some work involves translating from and into English and the textbook includes theory in English.

GENERAL GOALS AND LEARNING OUTCOMES

At end of the semester, students will demonstrate complexe skills in communication across ethnic, cultural, ideological, and national boundaries, and appreciate other cultures and patterns of thought.

Students will also employ communicative skills (e.g. speaking, listening, reading, and/or writing) in Catalan. They will be able to describe and analyze the cultural contexts and manifestations of the peoples who speak Catalan. One of the objectives is for them to compare and contrast the cultures and communities of Catalan with their own. Students will also demostrate their ability to read and understand literary texts written in Catalan.

By the end of this course, students will be expected to demonstrate:

- The ability to recall and use all the grammatical structures covered in the course textbook appropriately and accurately.
- The ability to speak and write about familiar topics accurately.
- The ability to handle in Catalan a variety of simulated situations.

- The ability to work independently to consolidate and foster language skills.
- The ability to extract relevant information from edited aural material.
- The ability to write simple letters in both formal and informal registers.

Participation:

Students are expected to attend class regularly. To derive the utmost benefit from instruction, attendance is essential. Failure to attend class always results in missed opportunities to hear and speak Catalan. Please remember that if you miss a class, you are responsible for contacting your instructor or other classmates to obtain any missed information.

Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class period. Students who arrive more than 5 minutes late will lose 1 point from the participation grade for that day.

Each week, participation will be evaluated. This is the criteria:

Below average: 2 pointsWell below average: 1 point

Two unexcused absences are allowed for the entire semester.

Deures (homeworks):

You will need to do homework exercises every day of class. The course will follow both books *Veus 1* very closely. Some exercises will be also provided in class during the course.

Some short readings and songs will be provided during the course. They will be part of the classroom reading on the exam.

Redacció (written exercise):

You will write three short essays on an assigned theme. The steps for this will be given in class. Generally, the assignment will be given on Friday and due the following Monday. These short texts will be graded and corrected.

Midterm tests (2)

- Intended to encourage students to review the material learned up to that point.
- Each test will have the following sections: Classroom, reading, reading, vocabulary, grammar, writing and listening comprehension.

Oral exam:

- The exam will consist of a role-play/interview with another classmate for 5-8 minutes. You will be given 3-4 minutes to thing about the topic, after which time you will have to perform the task in front of your instructor. You will not be able to have any notes.

Final exam:

- The exam will include the following sections: Classroom reading, reading, vocabulary, grammar, writing and listening comprehension.

If you are absent from any exam or test you must contact your instructor within one working day from the exam date. You must provide written documentation for your absence or a penalty will be given. Students you miss an exam or test without an excused absence will not be allowed to take the text.

The final mark for this course will be made up with coursework and written and oral examinations.
