Dr. Cynthia Clopper is an Associate Professor in the Department of Linguistics and an Associate Director of the Center for Cognitive and Brain Sciences. Her major areas of expertise are phonetics, speech perception, sociophonetics, and laboratory phonology. Dr. Clopper's current research projects examine the relationships between linguistic and social sources of variation in speech processing, the effects of experience on the perception of regional dialect variation, and the prosodic structure of American English and Paraguayan Guaraní. She advises undergraduate and graduate research projects in these and related areas and was awarded a Distinguished Undergraduate Research Mentor award in 2008. Dr. Clopper teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in phonetics and quantitative data analysis (statistics). She is also the Faculty Honors Advisor in Linguistics and the program advisor for the undergraduate Cognitive Science minor.
