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Dear Paula and Ashley,

Late last week and early this week, the Arts and Humanities Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee e-voted on a new course request for History 2066 (with GE Historical Study). The course was approved unanimously with the following recommendations:

- Request that Department notify Film Studies about new course (there might be interest on their part);
- When course is taught, add specific dates in schedule;
- Add film directors in syllabus.

Provided the course is subsequently approved all the way through the Office of the University Registrar, History 2066 will be a new course with GE Historical Study starting Autumn 2014.

Please know that the GE assessment plan will need to be implemented each time History 2066 is offered and GE data gathered. After the second offering of the course, the Department of History will be asked to submit an initial report summarizing GE assessment results of those first two offerings (following the format of sections I and II of the Assessment Report Requirement in Appendix 6 of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual [p. 75] [https://ascas.osu.edu/sites/ascas.osu.edu/files/ASC\\_CurrAssess\\_Operations\\_Manual.pdf](https://ascas.osu.edu/sites/ascas.osu.edu/files/ASC_CurrAssess_Operations_Manual.pdf)). Our program assistant Danielle Hogle (hogle.12) can help the Department with any aspect of the GE assessment requirement. She will also make sure to contact the Department before the course is offered and provide any assistance that the faculty member(s) may need. Could you please communicate this information to the faculty member(s) who will be teaching the course?

History 2066 will next be advanced to the full ASCC Curriculum Committee for the standard 2-weeks comments period.
