LATIN 170: INTENSIVE LATIN WORKSHOP, part I (10credit hours)

The Department of Greek and Latin will offer an INTENSIVE LATIN WORKSHOP during SUMMER QUARTER 2007. This Workshop will meet daily from 9:00-12:00 and from 1:00-4:00. We will cover all the Latin Grammar you will need to read major authors in the first five weeks, covering the material in Latin 101-104. The second course in this series will be offered during the second summer session (Latin 270). In Latin 270 students will be read major classical authors (Vergil, Cicero and Catullus), covering the equivalent of two 200-level Latin courses. Other authors will be selected according to student interest.

This course will require a full-time commitment from both the teachers and the students. Typically there will be four to six hours of homework every day (this includes both written assignments and memorization of forms and grammatical categories), a quiz every morning and a three hour exam every Monday. During the first term, June 20 to July 22, the emphasis will fall on the memorization of forms and on learning and applying the basic rules of Latin syntax and grammar. Morning classes will begin with a quiz and then go over the exercises for the previous evening; afternoon classes will introduce forms and basic concepts in a lecture. Staff will be available for office hours before, during and after the workshop and students will be able to call instructors at home if there are difficulties with any of the evening assignments. The Computers in the Departmental Library will be available for students who wish to explore and use the Latin Home Page, which includes resources developed specifically for the Latin Workshop as well as interactive pages for help in memorization of forms and rules. We are committed to helping students learn to read and use Latin in a very short time and will do what we can to make this possible. It is NOT recommended that students hold down jobs or have other significant commitments during the Workshop.

During the second term, July 27 to August 26, the class will read sections from major writers of the Classical and Medieval periods. We will definitely offer Vergil and Ovid and will try to meet the interests and needs of students in our other selections (e.g. Augustine, Medieval or Renaissance Latin).

Course Objectives: To introduce students to the fundamentals of Classical Latin grammar and syntax by covering the content of Latin 101-104 in five weeks. The approach is analytic and conceptual and ultimately offers the student a surer foundation for the reading and understanding of Latin than the traditional elementary sequence.

Workshop Objectives and Advantages:

- * Read real Latin for five weeks (this is Latin 270, equivalent of 2 200 level courses)
- * Register for reading courses by Autumn quarter
- * The best choice for talented undergraduates who need to satisfy the Arts and Sciences foreign language requirement.
- * This workshop will satisfy the prerequisites for the 200-level reading course and most students will be able to enroll in 600 level author and genre courses by the end of 2005-2006
- * On-line quizzes and review materials
- * Invited lecturers every Friday will get beyond the nuts and bolts

Class Schedule: The Workshop will meet in 448 UH every morning. There will be a 3 hour exam every Monday morning from 9 A.M. – 12 noon. Every TWRF morning class will begin at 9:00 with a 10 minute quiz followed by drills and homework review. After coffee at about 10:30, there will be continued review of the homework and discussion of concepts. The afternoon session will meet in 448 UH for introduction to new material (MTWR) at 1:00. On Friday afternoon, a review session of the week's material will be given in preparation for Monday's exam. After this review, all members of the Workshop, including instructors, students, and significant others, are invited to meet off campus for refreshments, relaxation.
