On Thursday, April 3, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a course change request for ASC 3200.

I am happy to report that the request was unanimously approved.

The Panel had a couple of recommendations/feedback items that the faculty member might like to consider when the course is taught:

- P. 1 of syllabus: incomplete sentence at the bottom: "(see Directions for CarmenConnect in this syllabus; if you're ):"
- The Panel noticed that the word "exercise" rather than "exam" is used for the mid-term and final. This is a change from the previous version of the course. What is the rationale for the change in terminology? Is the purpose to make the assignments feel less like exams?

ASC 3200 will next advance to the full ASC Curriculum Committee for the standard 2-weeks comments period.
