Kate,

On Thursday, April 3, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a course change request for Public Affairs 2110 (add GE Social Science--Human, Natural, and Economic Resources).

I am happy to report that the request was unanimously approved.

The Panel had one recommendation that the faculty member close the loop for the GE assessment plan. Make sure that there is a follow-up/feedback process. Once the faculty collects the data on student achievement, how will he/she use this information to make course improvements? How will this information be archived?

Provided the course is subsequently approved all the way through the Office of the University Registrar, Public Affairs 2110 will have GE status starting Spring 2015.

Please know that the GE assessment plan will need to be implemented each time Public Affairs 2110 is offered and GE data gathered. After the second offering of the course, the John Glenn School will be asked to submit an initial report summarizing GE assessment results of those first two offerings (following the format of sections I and II of the Assessment Report Requirement in Appendix 6 of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual [p. 75] https://asccas.osu.edu/sites/asccas.osu.edu/files/ASC_CurrAssess_Operations_Manual.pdf). Our program assistant Danielle Hogle (hogle.12) can help JGS with any aspect of the GE assessment requirement. She will also make sure to contact the School before the course is offered and provide any assistance that the faculty member(s) may need. Could you please communicate this information to the faculty member(s) who will be teaching the course?

Public Affairs 2110 will next advance to the full ASC Curriculum Committee for the standard 2-weeks comments period.
