Scott and Elizabeth,

On Thursday, November 13, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed requests to add GE Diversity—Global Studies to Anthropology 3302 and 3416.

Please find below the feedback of the Panel:

- 1. Anthropology 3302 (existing course; requesting GE Diversity—Global Studies): The Panel did not take a vote on the course but would like the following points to be addressed first:
 - Syllabus does not clearly show potential Diversity—Global Studies aspect of the course. Large part of the course seems to deal with the U.S. Some of it is more about immigrant experience in the U.S.
 - Assessment plan is more about assessment of course, not GE assessment.
- 2. Anthropology 3416 (existing course; requesting GE Diversity—Global Studies): The Panel approved the request with three contingencies listed below.
 - Syllabus:
 - o Add GE goals and expected learning outcomes on actual syllabus.
 - o Add pertinent weblinks to statements about academic misconduct & disability.
 - Assessment plan: How does faculty member define success for the sample embedded questions? Need some type of metric.

I will return the proposals to the Department queue via curriculum.osu.edu so that the points above can be addressed.
