Students will gain an understanding of the assessment, treatment, and rehabilitation process used by Speech-Language Pathologists and Audiologists. During this course students will begin to integrate academic work with the clinical practice of the field. The knowledge gained will prepare students to implement clinical methods in future clinical experiences. This course is designed for students interested in pursuing graduate work in Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology and will satisfy the observation hour requirement from ASHA.

- Describe common skills and techniques utilized for evaluation of hearing disorders.
- Describe common skills and techniques for treatment of common hearing disorders.

Course materials

Course materials will be provided via Master Clinician Network and Carmen. By the first scheduled class time OR prior, register as a student on Master Clinician Network at www.masterclinician.org. Be sure to indicate you are an OSU student. The cost to subscribe is \$20.00.

Once you are registered as a student user, you may begin viewing videos. After each video, you must submit an "Observational Review Form" to receive credit for that observation. I will approve each Observational Review Form, if appropriate. At the end of the class you will be provided a summary report of all observations from Master Clinician.

<u>Carmen</u>: Additional videos will be provided on Carmen. Each video will have an accompanying quiz similar to the Observational Review Form completed via Master Clinician. You must complete the quiz and receive a rating of 'satisfactory' to receive credit for that observation. A summary report of all observations completed via Carmen will be provided to you at the end of the semester.

We are submitting a request to offer SHS 3360 during Spring Semester 2015. We realize that the deadline for adding courses is past; however, we hope that you will accept our late request.

SHS 3360 is a course designed to provide clinical observation experiences for students interested in pursuing a graduate degree in Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology. This course is optional and will not be required for the major. The motivation for offering this course was precipitated by the increasing number of undergraduate majors in Speech & Hearing Science (450+) and the demand that was being placed on clinicians in the community by our students seeking out an observation placement.
