Dear Charlie,

On Wednesday, January 14, the SBS Panel of the ASCC reviewed a proposed revision to the Neuroscience Minor.

The Panel did not take a vote but would like the following points to be addressed first:

- Clarify whether this will be 4 different minors or one minor with different tracks.
- Bring list of elective courses in molecular/cellular neuroscience minor in proposal (p. 2) and list of courses on advising sheet in line.
- P. 3: 5614 is listed 3 times. Only the first iteration has the correct title.
- Bottom of p. 3: Weblink is incorrect. The correct rules governing minors can be found on p. 80 of the 2014-15 ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual https://ascas.osu.edu/files/ASC_CurrAssess_Operations_Manual.pdf Last sentence of p.3 is confusing: (1) there is a sentence fragment and (2) since Biology 1113 is a prereq for Neuroscience 3000 (a required course in all 4 minor options), the statement “we assume that all students wanting to pursue a minor in neuroscience will have completed at least Biology 1113” seems to be an understatement.
- It is not clear what Chemistry 1110 or 1210 are a prereq to in the general neuroscience minor and in the specialized minors. The core courses do not seem to require either course.
- Advising sheet: Suggestion to specify that Biology 1113 and Psychology 1100 are prereqs for core courses (Neuroscience 3000 and Psychology 3313/3513, respectively). Perhaps indicate the same for Chemistry 1110/1210—though at this point the Panel does not see that Chemistry is a prereq for a core course (see point above).
- Update advising sheet for new CAA guidelines. See pp. 80-81 of operations manual (weblink above). Work with Curriculum and Assessment Office on aligning language to new guidelines.
