# STUDY TOUR: OSU DANCE IN BRAZIL DANCE 5798 3 Credit Hours

OSU: Sullivant Hall 250/247: Jan 11-March 8, T-F, 12:45-2:40 (as needed)

Salvador, Brazil: March 9-22, 2016

Pre-requisites: Dance 5194 in AU15 (1 credit) and Dance 4700/6700 in AU15 (1 credit)

#### **Partner Institution**

Clara Ramos, Director of ACBEU in Salvador, Brazil, will serve as the primary incountry contact. Susan Hadley conducted a site visit in Salvador in May 2015 during which she and Ramos planned performances, classes, tours of the city, art events, and community activities.

#### **Course Description**

OSU DANCE IN BRAZIL includes eight weeks of study abroad preparation on the OSU campus followed by a thirteen-day tour in Salvador, Brazil. At OSU, a group of eleven BFA and MFA in Dance students will rehearse a program of dances to perform in theatres and community centers in Salvador, Brazil. Dancers will perform in theatres, community centers, dance schools and public schools. OSU dancers will teach dance classes in hip-hop, jazz, modern, and US social dance forms as well as take classes from Brazilian artists in capoeira, samba and Afro-Brazilian dance. Students will visit historical and cultural sites, attend music and dance concerts and participate in community engagement activities.

#### **Course Goals and Objectives**

At the successful completion of the course the student will demonstrate ability to:

- participate as a group member on an international trip with the highest degree of personal responsibility and positive contribution to the group
- represent one's self, one's institution, and one's country with integrity
- engage in intercultural collaboration with sensitivity
- create and rehearse a program of dances that includes solos and group works choreographed by students, faculty, and professional artists
- perform dance repertory in a range of performance venues, from formal theatres to informal community spaces
- take dance classes in a variety of Brazilian forms, demonstrating professional level skill and respect for master teachers
- teach community dance classes in modern, jazz, tap, hip-hop or US social dance

### **Academic Components**

#### 1. COURSE SYLLABUS

#### 2. CREDIT HOUR RATIONALE

This experience will span both Autumn 2015 and Spring 2016, awarding two credits per semester. One credit covers the rehearsal/repertory class each semester. The second credit Fall Semester is for the class in Brazilian History and Culture, offered once a week by either the Department of Spanish and Portuguese or AAAS. The second credit Spring Semester covers the twelve-day tour in Salvador, Brazil.

Regardless of the number of weekly hours in rehearsal, all repertory classes in the Department of Dance are one credit hour. This approach, shared by the School of Music, regards the copious hours that performing arts student spend in rehearsal as reflective of practicing the art form and gives credit with regard to maintaining the limit of 18 credit hours per semester before additional tuition costs set in.

#### 3. STUDENT ENROLLMENT

OSU Dance Brazil will serves twelve OSU BFA and MFA dance majors, who will rehearse, teach, and perform as a student dance company. A majority of the dancers will be undergraduate students; however one graduate student will serve as the assistant rehearsal director of the rehearsal process.

Auditions for this repertory dance company are on February 1, 2015. They include a two-hour dancing audition, as well as a one-page questionnaire. A panel of three faculty judges will determine the cast, considering the movement audition, questionnaire, academic standing, and departmental citizenship of each applicant.

The faculty selection panel will choose four men and eight women from current freshmen, sophomore and junior undergraduates and first or second year graduate students. Attention will be paid to diversity, as well as students' versatility in a range of dance forms including modern dance and dance forms of the African Diaspora (jazz, hip-hop, tap, social dance). Students must elect to focus on this project for two semesters to the exclusion of participation in other repertory such as Dance Downtown, MFA project concerts and Spring Student Concert.

Student dancers will be notified of their selected by February 6, 2015, in time to meet with Dean Garett Heysel to discuss and apply for various funding opportunities on February 8. They will enroll in Dance 5798 for three credits in Autumn 2015 and for two credits in Spring 2016.

4. This course number of 5798 was approved through the ASC curriculum approval process during the semester conversion. The Department of Dance will be submitting a one-time course request during January for review by college and university curriculum committees.

Undergraduates will use these course credits to fulfill five (5) of the 22 Focus Curriculum requirements for the final two years of their BFA program. Graduate students will use these credits in the categories of Research/Creative Activity or Electives.

#### **Allocation**

The proposed syllabus contains approximately 58 hours of formalized instruction, in addition to approximately 55 hours of structured educational experiences for a total of 113 hours.

All rehearsals at OSU and classes taken in Brazil are listed under formalized instruction. All performances and cultural exchanges are listed under structured educational experience.

Per the Arts & Sciences Curriculum guidelines equating 12.5 hours of formalized instruction and/or 25 hours of structured educational experiences per credit hour (or 37 ½ hours of formalized instruction per 3 credit hour course), the Department of Dance requests that Dance 5798 be valued at 3 total credit hours.
