Dear Pasha,

Yesterday, the Natural and Mathematical Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a proposal to remove the lab component from Animal Science 2300H and offer it as a lecture-only course.

I am happy to report that the Panel unanimously approved the request with one contingency, namely: Does this change impact (1) the GE assessment plan and (2) the course goals/learning objectives (i.e., by removing the H lab will some of these learning objectives disappear)? Please provide an explanation.

Also, will you change the prereq./concur. information for Animal Sciences 2200.02 to “2200.01 or 2300H, or permission of instructor” (right now, it only says, “2200.01, or permission of instructor”) and remove its current exclusion of Animal Science 2300H? That way, students who will take 2300H and 2200.02 will actually be able to fulfill a GE Natural Science—Biological Sciences requirement with lab credit.

I will return the course via curriculum.osu.edu to enable the department to answer the questions above.
