This program leads to a tagged Bachelor of Arts in Journalism degree. Requirements for Students Admitted to the Major SU12 and later. Nine (9) COMM courses totaling at least 32 credits are required. A grade of C- or better is required in all courses in the major. A 2.0 GPA in the major is required.



Program Area Description

Public Affairs Journalism teaches you how to investigate and disseminate news. Our multimedia focus prepares you to integrate this training with the skills necessary for packaging news stories with word, still photo, audio, and video.

As a journalism student, you also are taught to consider the context in which you will practice in the field, including an understanding of the social, legal, and ethical implications that all journalists encounter.

To emphasize applied learning, students are provided extensive skills training, further reinforced through experience at The Lantern, completion of a minor, and a required news-related internship.

Required Pre-Major courses: 6 credit hours (these courses do not count in the major). To be considered for admission to the major, students must complete these two pre-major courses. A grade of C- or better is required in both courses. Admission is competitive and an online application is required. Please see comm.ohio-state.edu for application deadlines.
