This week the SBS Panel e-voted on requests to add GE Diversity-Social Diversity in the US to Sociology 3200 and GE Diversity-Global Studies to Sociology 5450.

Both requests were unanimously approved with the contingencies and recommendations listed below:

Sociology 3200 (1 contingency and 4 recommendations)

- Contingency: Provide the rubric and an example of how it is used to assess whether the written assignments meet the ELOs.
- Recommendations: (1) Remove A+ from the Grading Scale: (2) Add D+ to Grading Scale; (3) Add Disabilities Services link to statement; and (4) Add 16 pt. font to ODS Statement.

Sociology 5450 (1 contingency and 1 recommendation)

- Contingency: Provide the rubric and an example of how it is used to assess whether the video assignment meet the ELOs.
- Recommendation: Grading Scale Points need to be adjusted. If student earns 186 pts, do they receive an "A" or "A-"?

 - *Contingency*: Clarify what research presentation is and if any formal "paper" needs to be submitted.

- o The question was raised of whether there are enough readings for a 3-hr seminar. Indeed, every week there are 20-40 pp. of reading for this graduate course. Maybe there will be additional readings linked to the outside speakers? As such, the course does not seem to be a 3 credit hr graduate course.
