- Please inform the Dept of Geography (Morton O'Kelly, Chair; <u>okelly.1@osu.edu</u>), the School of Earth Sciences (Berry Lyons, Director; <u>lyons.142@osu.edu</u>), and the School of Environmental Sciences (Jeff Sharp, Director; <u>sharp.123@osu.edu</u>) about this new freshman seminar.
- Students often do not realize that a course is taught for a half-term and are surprised/confused. Perhaps adding a line or two to the meeting times section in the syllabus would help: e.g., "This seminar meets for the first half of Spring term, from XX to YY.
 Grades will be submitted at half term, and there will be no meeting times in the second half of Spring term."
- It is recommended that you use the official ASC-approved statement on academic misconduct and the statement about disability services (recommended 16 pt font) as found here http://asccas.osu.edu/curriculum/asc-syllabus-elements
 In other words:
