



Globalization is the process by which countries, through increasing contact, communication and trade, come closer together to create a single global system in which developments in one part of the world can profoundly affect individuals and communities in other parts of the world. This major provides an opportunity to explore from an interdisciplinary perspective the forms that globalization takes, the forces that shape them, and their consequences for the life chances of individuals and communities worldwide, as well as for the global system itself.

2. COMPLETION OF A FOREIGN LANGUAGE MINOR. Students must complete a foreign language minor to complete this major. CHOOSE FROM: *Andean & Amazonian Studies, Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Modern Greek, Persian, Portuguese, Russian, Slavic & East European Languages & Cultures, Somali, Spanish, Swahili, or Turkish.* Completion of a **SECOND MAJOR** in a foreign language will also satisfy this requirement.

3. ELECTIVES: 18 hours

Complete at least 18 credit hours of major electives. Students must choose a minimum of 6 credit hours in each of three sections:

- A. Economy, Environment and Health (6 hours)
- B. Violence, Conflict and Reconciliation (6 hours)
- C. Global Cultures, Networks and Institutions (6 hours)
