Prof. **Ludmila Isurin** was educated in Russia and the US and has taught in universities of three countries (Russia, Israel, and the US) and as a Visiting Fellow in Germany. During her career at OSU she has taught numerous undergraduate courses, including a few GE courses (*Russian Culture, East European Experience in America; Bilingualism: Life in Two Worlds;* she designed the latter). She is a very interdisciplinary scholar whose research interests encompass social sciences and humanities. In 2016 she received the award for the most outstanding article of the year (Journal of *Language Learning*). She is an author of five books including the most recent monograph on which the proposed seminar is partly based (*Collective Remembering: Memory in the World and in the Mind*, Cambridge University Press, 2017).
