Dear Professor Anderson, we have recently submitted a new course request for a graduate health economics course (Economics 8856) to our college curriculum committee. We did so for two reasons while we wait for your reply to our concurrence inquiry. First, we would like to offer Economics 8856 Health Economics in Spring 2017, and second, we have received concurrence from College of Public Health, College of Public Affairs, Department of Sociology, and Department of Agricultural, Environmental and Development Economics (AED Economics). The college curriculum committee will have its last semester meeting this Wednesday, and thus, if at all possible, we would like to receive your favorable response. For your information, I have reproduced below our chair's concurrence request email in September and the syllabus attached therewith. I am also attaching a concurrence response form. But, in lieu of the form, an email is very much welcome. As soon as I receive your email, I would like to forward it to our college curriculum committee. We have offered this health economics course as a pilot course (Economics 8194) for our advanced PhD students in the last three years. At this juncture we must have it either as a new course (Economics 8856) or as a revamped pilot course (new 8194).

The proposed course is designed to introduce second-year PhD students in economics to an applied microeconomics area that is allied closely to the methodology of labor economics and empirical industrial economics. The prerequisites are the first PhD courses in microeconomics and in econometrics, which generally limits the course enrollment to our own or AED Economics PhD students, for whom our first-year PhD core courses are required. In the pilot course (8194), we had 6-10 PhD students from our own program and from the AED Economics program. We nevertheless hope that by this PhD field course we contribute positively to the recent surge of interest, both academic and policy, in the economics of health as well as the OSU's overall intellectual and organizational capital. I would welcome any comment or question you might have. Best Regards,
