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Dear Chris,

On Tuesday, November 22, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee considered new course proposals for History 3706 (with GE Historical Study and GE Diversity-Social Diversity in the US) and History 3798.05 (with GE Historical Study and GE Education Abroad).

Please find below the feedback of the Panel:

- 1) History 3706: unanimously approved with two recommendations:
  - One panel member indicated that the title of the course could be misleading—since the course deals with other corporations than only Coca-Cola.
  - P. 4 of syllabus: Exams are said to be worth 45%, whereas on the previous page they are worth 40%. Given that the other course assignments add up to 60%, the exams should be 40%.
  
- 2) History 3798.05: unanimously approved

I am including the usual reminder that the GE assessment plans for those courses will need to be implemented from the very first offering of the courses and GE data gathered. As is the case for all new GE courses, after the second offering of each course, the Assessment Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee will ask the department to submit an initial report summarizing GE assessment results of those first two offerings (following the format of sections I and II of the Assessment Report Requirement in Appendix 9 of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual [p. 121] [https://asccas.osu.edu/sites/asccas.osu.edu/files/ASC\\_CurrAssess\\_Operations\\_Manual.pdf](https://asccas.osu.edu/sites/asccas.osu.edu/files/ASC_CurrAssess_Operations_Manual.pdf)). For History 3798.05, the report will need to be written in conjunction with the equivalent Microbiology course. Our Program Assistant Danielle (hogle.12) can help the department with any aspect of the GE assessment requirement. She will also make sure to contact the department before the courses are offered and provide any assistance that may be needed with assessment. Could you please communicate this information to the faculty members?

History 3706 and 3798.05 will now continue through the approval process.
