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Dear Chris,

On Friday, February 24, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee considered a new course proposal for History 2680 (with GE Historical Study and GE Diversity-Global Studies).

The Panel unanimously approved the course with two comments:

- Clarify the grading scale for the course. The grading scale lists an A as a 92 and above and an A- as an 89-92. A B is an 82-86 and a B- is a 79-82. C is 72-76 and C- is 69-72. If a student receives a 92, 82, or 72, their letter grade will be unclear.
- The NELC cross-listing (NELC 2680) should be made an exclusion on curriculum.osu.edu. I will make that change for you before advancing the course.

I am sure the department knows the standard GE assessment reminder. However, in case you decide to notify the faculty member by forwarding the present e-mail, here it is again:

The GE assessment plan will need to be implemented from the very first offering of the course and GE data gathered. After the second offering of the course, the Assessment Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee will ask the department to submit an initial report summarizing GE assessment results of those first two offerings (following the format of sections I and II of the Assessment Report Requirement in Appendix 9 of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual [p. 121]

The report will need to be written in conjunction with the equivalent NELC course. The Assessment Panel and/or our office can help the department with any aspect of the GE assessment requirement. We will also make sure to contact the department before the course is offered and provide any assistance that may be needed with assessment.

History 2680 will now continue through the approval process.
