On Wednesday, April 12, the Arts and Humanities 2 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a revised syllabus for your proposed new first-year seminar.

I am happy to report that the Panel unanimously approved the seminar with a few recommendations:

- Panel feels that a reading on the first day of class may be asking too much of firstyear students.
- Weeks 4-9 are in groups of two weeks in the course schedule with one reading for the two-week groupings. The panel recommends breaking down the readings by week so the students know when readings should be completed.
- The schedule only allows one week for all the presentations, which may not be enough time for all students to give ten-minute presentations. The panel recommends revising the course schedule to allow for two weeks of presentations.
