Yesterday, the Arts and Humanities 2 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a proposal to create a new minor in Comparative Studies.

I am happy to report that the proposal was unanimously approved by the Panel with one recommendation:

Page 3 states the following under Electives, "Any three courses in Comparative Studies at the 2000 level or above. At least two of the electives must be at the 3000 level or above." Of course, the second sentence is included to comply with university minor rules. However, together those two sentences seem odd. It would be clearer to simply state, "One Comparative Studies course at the 2000 level or above and two Comparative Studies courses at the 3000 level or above." A similar statement occurs on p. 5 (the advising sheet) and the Panel recommend that you correct that as well.

The proposal will next be reviewed by the full ASC Curriculum Committee at its meeting on Friday, April 21, 8:30-10:30AM in 200 Bricker. Could one or both of you come to the meeting to talk about the minor and answer potential questions from the members of the ASCC? Thank you for letting me know.
