Music 7805.02 - Master Degree Recital (concerto performance)

The Master Degree Piano Concerto Recital consists of a piano concerto from the piano concerti canon performed from memory accompanied by an orchestral reduction performed on a 2nd piano. The program should be 55-70 minutes and its length may be supported by an additional piano concerto or piano chamber music including two piano or music for four hands demonstrating technical security and musical understanding, communicating the music's essence in a meaningful and polished manner to a live audience. Preparation is in the form of daily practice supported by weekly lessons and studio class performance. Style, technique, sound production, phrasing, performance practice and the specific challenges of performing as soloist with orchestra are among the many topics explored in weekly lessons with the applied instructor. Collaborative playing and the problems specifically associated with that art form are explored in ensemble coaching with members of the piano faculty and other SOM applied faculty. Studio and departmental performances are additional preparatory tools for this recital.
