On Tuesday, September 12, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee considered a request to change the number of Philosophy 1850 (an existing course with GE Cultures and Ideas) to 2850.

The Panel approved the request with two contingencies and one recommendation:

- Contingencies:
 - o P. 3 of syllabus: Policies concerning late work, extensions and plagiarism:
 - "F" does not exist at OSU. Please replace with "E."
 - "Plagiarism or academic dishonesty will not only be reflected in your grade, but will also be reported to the Committee on Academic Misconduct." One cannot penalize a student before they have been judged by the academic misconduct committee. The statement in the syllabus should be adjusted to reflect this.
 - o Since this is a GE course, please include a current GE assessment plan.
- Recommendation:
 - o Disability statement is not the most recent and Student Life Disability Services moved over a year ago. Please update to the most recent disability statement.
