Dear all,

On Tuesday, October 24, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a new course request for History 3798.06 (with GE Historical Study and GE Diversity—Global Studies).

The Panel approved the course with one contingency and a few recommendations:

- Contingency: Request concurrence from the Dept of French and Italian. (Meanwhile, this has been taken care of by Garrett Heysel. FRIT granted concurrence for the new course.)
- Recommendation to correct following typos:
 - P. 1: Learning objectives: “Understand two connected but distinct national histories of multiculturalism and ethnic pluralism in light of . . .”: unfinished sentence.
 - P. 2: PASS program is incorrectly stated to be the “Program for Advising in Scholarship and Service.” It actually is the “Program for Advancing Scholarship and Service.”
 - P. 2: Last line: Structured is misspelled (“Sructured”). P. 3: “History 3xxx” should be replaced by finalized course number. That said, the whole explanation about credit hours should more than likely be removed when the course is taught. Indeed, this is an explanation necessary for curricular approval—not of interest to students.
 - P. 7: Typo: “Old Media” instead of “Old Medina.”

As always, I am including a reminder that the GE assessment plan will need to be implemented from the very first offerings of the course and GE data gathered. As is the case for all new GE courses, after the second offering of the course, the Assessment Panel will ask the department to submit an initial report summarizing GE assessment results of those first two offerings (following the format in Appendix 10 of the ASC Curriculum and Assessment Operations Manual [p. 126] https://asccas.osu.edu/sites/asccas.osu.edu/files/ASC_CurrAssess_Operations_Manual.pdf). The Assessment Panel and/or our office can help the department with any aspect of the GE assessment requirement. Shelby Oldroyd, Curriculum and Assessment Assistant, will also make sure to contact the department before the course is offered and provide any assistance that may be needed with assessment. Could you please make sure that all faculty who teach this course going forward are aware of this assessment requirement?

The course will now be advanced to OAA and OUR.
