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Dear Professor Lindsey and Jackie,

On Thursday, January 11, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a proposal for new course WGSS 2326S .

The proposal was unanimously approved by the Panel with three contingencies and three recommendations:

- <u>Contingencies</u>:
 - o Check with Office of Research whether IRB is necessary.
 - o Clarify how contact hours will work once service learning starts. That is, how many contact hours per week will be devoted to formal instruction vs. service-learning part.
 - o Ask for concurrence from College of Social Work.
- <u>Recommendations</u>:
 - One of the required texts for the course dates back to 1976. Isn't there a 21st century text available?
 - The term "volunteering" is usually not used in the context of a service-learning experience. The panel believes the course materials would be strengthened if service-OKlearning language was used for the educational component instead of "volunteering."
 - ADAMH Franklin (Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Board of Franklin County) could be mentioned in syllabus. That agency might even have a speaker that could come talk to the class.

I will return the course via curriculum.osu.edu in a minute to enable the department to address the feedback above.
