On Tuesday, March 27, the Social and Behavioral Sciences Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a proposal to change the current Psychology Master of Arts to a Master of Science.

The Panel did not take a vote on the proposal but would like two points to be addressed first:

- The Panel would like to see the current graduate curriculum (with courses) included in the

proposal. That will strengthen the Department of Psychology's argument that this is a science-based program.

- About how many students would this change affect? That is, approximately how many students end up graduating with a master's?
