On Thursday, March 29, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed your proposal for a new first-year seminar, "Why Wakanda Matters: Utopias/Dystopias and the Legacies of Slavery and Empire."

The Panel did not vote on the proposal but would like the following points addressed first:

- Are students expected to have seen those movies on their own? If so, that would be a lot of
