Good afternoon,

On Tuesday, October 9, the Arts and Humanities 1 Panel of the ASC Curriculum Committee reviewed a proposal to revise the Turkish and Central Asia Studies minor. I am happy to report that proposal was unanimously approved with the following recommendations:

- The panel feels very strongly that a student should not be able to receive a minor by only taking 2000 level courses, even if the courses are upper-division foreign language courses. The panel recommends including a rule or advising students to take at least one 3000+ level course.
- The implementation date of Autumn 2018 on page 1 needs to be updated.
- Correct typos on revised departmental minor sheet on page 6:
  - Turkish 3001 is a 4 credit course, not a 3 credit course
  - Include the course number for Turkish 3350 “Contemporary Issues in Turkey”
