Dear Richard,

We are not planning any course in this area. Our primary Neo-Latinist, Carl Schlam, died about 10 years ago. Frank is interested, but not more so than in earlier Medieval Literature. If he does want to teach in the area sometime, he can teach it through CMRS. He does most of his Medieval Latin teaching via CMRS courses. We have only one Medieval Latin course that we offer every other year. So go for it. Keep us informed. You might consult with Frank directly to get his input. He happens to be in Columbus right now.

Dear David,

There has been a discussion around CMRS about the advisability of offering a regular course (presumably at a senior undergraduate/graduate course) on Neo-Latin (in practice, I suspect, Medieval Latin, but to keep our Renaissance clientele happy, we should at least allow for the possibility of a course on More or Erasmus). Before going any further I thought I should check with you that this would not be treading on any toes in Greek and Latin. I know that Frank sometimes teaches such a course, but I've been given to understand that it's generally a special-topics course, not a regular offering. Of course, if you are planning such a course as a regular offering we'd be delighted to leave it up to you and simply cross-list it at CMRS (and urge our students to take it).
